### SHALOM, B'NAI TIKVAH!

The sage Rabbi Chanina ben Teradion taught that when two people study words of Torah, God's presence rests between them. In part, this suggests that Jewish tradition reveals its wisdom most compellingly when we explore it together. Our sages consistently studied in *chevruta*, or pairs, so that each might draw on

the strengths of the other. That dynamic is alive and well at B'nai Tikvah, anytime groups gather for Torah Study, Adult Learning, and Sunday morning Religious School. Walking through the halls on these mornings, in addition to the knowledge imparted by our remarkable teachers in their classrooms, you'll see pairs of our older and younger students in the hallways and library reviewing Hebrew language skills. Our teen tutors are significant role models for the kids in our younger grades, who in turn give their tutors a chance to keep their knowledge fresh and to take their place in the generational transmission of Jewish learning and values.

As another secular year begins, Congregation B'nai Tikvah is taking some exciting leaps in our Adult Education Program. We have a lay-led group in formation that will be studying Mussar together – a spiritual tradition that offers wisdom and guidance by encouraging us to pay attention to how our inner traits affect our lives. Also beginning in January, we are excited to introduce a three part series in partnership with Lehrhaus Judaica, a Bay Area center for Adult Jewish Studies. This series, called "All in the Jewish Family," will be an exploration of interfaith relationships, interfaith families, and the dynamics of both within the life of our synagogue. Join Dawn Kepler, an expert teacher of these topics, on Sunday January 31, February 28 and March 13 from 10:00-11:30 am. If you can't attend all three, you can certainly come to one or two – each promises to be interactive and compelling. Classes are free to CBT members, \$5 for the public. Everyone is warmly invited to be part of All in the Jewish Family.

When this series concludes, we'll follow it in the best way possible: with more learning! Our second partnership with Lehrhaus will take place over six months beginning in March, and will focus on death and mourning in Jewish tradition. Details to come.

When two study words of Torah, God's presence rests between them. When we all learn together, a piece of who we are is indeed elevated. Join us, and help make B'nai Tikvah the best *Beit Midrash*, or house of study, that it can be. You're sure to learn something new – about the topic at hand, about your fellow members, about yourselves.

# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Welcome to 2016! It's hard to believe another year has come and gone in our community! I'm excited to share some of the great happenings at B'nai Tikvah and am looking forward to a fantastic year ahead. As always, if you have questions, concerns or comments, your Board of Trustees and I want to hear from you.

Our journey into Tikvah 2.0 continues as we keep the best of what's made B'nai Tikvah so special for 34 years while we introduce new traditions and activities. Tikvah 2.0 is more than a new brand and solar panels on our roof – which will be switched on early January saving us an estimated \$10,000/year in utility bills – it's a different way of thinking about what we all expect from B'nai Tikvah and what we can all contribute.

On December 11, I attended our community Hanukkah celebration where dozens of our members brought their menorahs and lit them at the beginning of the service along with the Rabbi and Cantor. As the warm glow from the candles and incredible music filled the sanctuary, I was heartened to see so many familiar and new faces. We are welcoming new members, opening our doors to friends and building our community. Good news!

As I'm writing this I want to acknowledge that we have had – and continue to have – some phenomenal programming to offer including an official Hollywood star and even international talent:

A Jewish Christmas Eve on December 24<sup>th</sup>... A movie and Chinese food. What could be more Jewish?

**Our Third Grade class participating in the Shabbat Service on January 8<sup>th</sup>...** Talk about cute!

An evening of jazz music with Marina Pakowski, Cantor Chabon and Harry Wittenberg on January 9<sup>th</sup>. Marina is a Jewish professional pianist and vocalist from France and our Cantor and Harry Wittenberg need no introductions.

A Red Carpet Evening with Mayim Bialik, one of the stars of the hit comedy the "Big Bang Theory" and a tireless advocate for Judaism and philanthropy discussing the challenges and opportunities for observant Jews in Hollywood.

I could go on, but the bottom line is that we have innovative new programming, a dynamic and growing community and a very bright future.

Of course, that future depends on growing our membership and stabilizing our income. Another hallmark of Tikvah 2.0 is transparency. At my High Holy Day appeal, I asked for 100% participation and set a goal of raising \$50,000 toward our operating budget. As of December 9<sup>th</sup>, we're at 27.5% of our goal for participation and 49.5% of our goal for fundraising. I wish those results were better, but they are what they are.

# **RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NEWS**

The Terrific Tutorim and Special Ed



In my last article I detailed the work of the Mighty Madrichim, our teen program of students who have graduated from our CBT religious school and are now helping teachers and students during school. About 10 of our 30 madrichim are in a specific program we call

the Tutorim. This is a tutoring program that works with all grades every Sunday helping all students work on and improve their Hebrew skills, as well as Hebrew prayers. For the 7<sup>th</sup> grade, the Tutorim help students prepare for B'nai Mitzvah by working on the morning service, Torah service, and each student's parsha (Torah portion) and Haftorah.

Before starting this position as co-interim director of education here at CBT, even though I have two children as students in the school, I did not know this Tutorim program existed. Now I've learned what an incredible program it is and what a great job they do. The program is run by Alex Verona, a young man who has grown up at CBT, went through the religious school, and was a madrich as a teenager. After graduating high school, Alex saw that there was a need for additional tutoring of the students of CBT, especially in the area of Hebrew learning. In response to that, he put together the Terrific Tutorim program. Every Sunday they organize learning for each student based on her/ his individual level and needs, pairing like students with a specific madrich (no more than 3 in a group). They meet with each class for 20 minutes and it runs like a well-oiled machine with serious learning happening in the hallways and classrooms. It's very impressive.

Another part of our religious school that not many people know about is that we have a teacher dedicated to help students with special needs—Jennifer Fennel. She is a very accomplished full-time high school teacher who is also dedicated to Jewish education, specifically to those students who have special needs here at CBT. Every Sunday she works one-on-one discreetly with students that teachers or parents have identified as needing extra resources. She also provides strategies and techniques to teachers on how to best serve children with a variety of learning styles. If you think Jennifer could be helpful to you and your family, please contact us. We feel fortunate to be able to provide such an important service to our families.

Finally, we are grateful for the generous support of the Jewish Federation of the Greater East Bay. For the last two years, they have given us significant grants in order to fund our special needs program. We are so blessed at CBT to have the teachers, madrichim and resources to make these programs possible. We can say with confidence that any child, no matter what their unique needs are, can have a meaningful and enriching religious school experience here at CBT.

# Contra Costa Midrasha

*Tikkun Olam* or Repair the World is a Jewish phrase that we often teach in Jewish education. We want our students to know not only that making the world a better place is an important Jewish value, but that it is their responsibility to do this work. This year at Contra Costa Midrasha we are taking a very "hands -on" approach to this work of *tikkun olam*.

Most recently, CCM reignited its Annual Veteran's Day of Service. This is the third year where CCM teens have gone out into the community to do service locally, on a day when they don't have school. This year, 14 teens travelled on November 11<sup>th</sup> (Veteran's Day) to Antioch where they served lunch to the veterans living at the Casa Verde transitional housing facility. The day included some meaningful sharing between the vets and our CCM teens. The teens asked questions about the vets' service in the Armed Forces and listened intently to the answers. At the end of the experience, teens expressed that the day had helped to break their assumptions and stereotypes about veterans – coming to understand that they "are people like us who've been through some really hard stuff." Many teens also heard the veterans' advice about life - encouraging them to stay on track, to find discipline and to have goals. It was an afternoon of true service, where both our teens and the veterans at Casa Verde were touched by each others' presence. In addition to bringing lunch, many CCM families also donated bedding items that will keep the Casa Verde vets warm this Winter. CCM thanks Casa Verde for opening its doors and our generous donors - the Brenden Mann Foundation, the Jewish Community Federation and Foundation of the East Bay and individual members like you for making work like this possible.

Our newest program, the **Teen** *Tikkun Olam* **Philanthropy Board** continues the philanthropy and leadership work of the Jewish Federation and Foundation of the East Bay's "Jewish Teen Foundation Network." Meeting once a month from Octo-

ber – May on Sunday afternoons, teens will learn leadership skills, the 4-1-1 of service and volunteerism and Jewish philanthropy and Tzedakah. Together, they will pick a mission, fundraise for that mission and distribute funds to organizations who do the work relevant to their mission. Specifically, teens who participate will literally become philanthropists and activists - raising money through various fundraising methods and going out in the field to do service work. While our formal fundraising won't begin until Winter of 2016, the program has already received matching funding from the Morton and Amy Friedkin Family Foundation and the Howard and Susan Geifman Philanthropic Fund of the Jewish Community Foundation. The CCM Teen Philanthropy Board aims to award \$15,000 -\$25,000 in grants to local, global, Jewish and Israeli organizations, which will be raised by the teen Board members themselves.

Lastly, this holiday season we continued our partnership with **Shalom Bayit's Hanukkah "Adopt-a-Family" program**. Shalom Bayit is the Bay Area's center for domestic violence prevention and response within the Jewish community. Our teens and families purchased gifts for the two families we adopted – helping to make their holiday season very special, even while coping with transitioning away from a domestic violence situation. On December 2<sup>nd</sup> we gathered and wraped all the gifts, which got delivered by the people and volunteers who work at Shalom Bayit.

### ALL IN THE JEWISH FAMILY

Three classes to explore Interfaith topics with Dawn Kepler, Rabbi Gutterman & Cantor Chabon

#### THE NON-JEW IN THE SYNAGOGUE Sunday, January 31, 2016

Our synagogue is blessed to have many interfaith couples as members, many of whom are very involved. That involvement has led to some common questions. How should I behave in services; should I do what the Jews are doing – bow, recite the Hebrew? How should I deal with lines like, 'thank you God for making me a Jew' when I'm not a Jew? I wonder if I'll be offending anyone by 'acting' like a Jew or by saying Shabbat Shalom or Shana Tovah. Does that make me an impostor? I'm not sure whether I'm allowed to touch the Torah. For better or worse, every synagogue has its own customs. Come learn about the customs and traditions at B'nai Tikvah. We can also touch on common practice at other shuls if you are anticipating visiting elsewhere for a family simcha.

#### INTERLOVE STORY: WHEN JEWS LOVE NON-JEWS AND JUDAISM Sunday, February 28, 2016

In 1994 Anne was a graduate student at Stanford University in the Film Department. For her Master's Thesis she made a short film (9 minutes) about her parents' intermarriage and titled it Interlove Story. In it she uses old family movies and current interviews with her parents to tell the story of their Catholic – Jewish marriage, the choices they made regarding religion in their home and the advice they gave her regarding her own relationship with a non-Jewish man. In her film, Anne does not propose any answers. She opens questions and relates choices, the choices that have brought her to be who she is. 
